Executive Summary

The Mizzou Alumni Association (MAA) sought a NEAT Grant for Alumni Relations to engage the senior alumni population in a purposeful way. One-sixth of the University's alumni base graduated 50 or more years ago, and the Association expects 25,000 additional alumni to enter this segment within the next 5 years. Senior alumni remain an important audience for both fundraising and volunteerism, so the Association aims to develop meaningful opportunities to engage them. The Mizzou Alumni Association did not have funding allocated for senior-specific programming during the current fiscal year, so the NEAT Grant allowed our organization to pilot a program to engage this important population.

Mizzou Alumni Association held Gold Medal Luncheons honoring 50+ year graduates in its two largest alumni markets: Kansas City and St. Louis. Both events engaged 100+ attendees and were very well received by Mizzou's "Golden Graduates".

Overview

Project Scope

The Mizzou Alumni Association launched a 3-year strategic plan in September 2022, which includes enhanced programming for alumni in various life stages. Through the NEAT Grant we were able to engage senior alumni (specifically those who graduated 50+ years ago) by hosting Gold Medal Society Programming. The senior audience possesses both "time" and "treasure"—and stewarding them via this meaningful recognition program could yield returns for other Association programming (e.g. Touring Tigers travel program) as well as gifts to the University. As a pilot effort, the Association focused on senior alumni engagement within its two largest alumni markets (Kansas City and St. Louis) where nearly 8,500 senior alumni live.

Process

The Association engaged 50+ year graduates in two strategic alumni markets: Kansas City and St. Louis through mailers/postcards and in-person events. A multi-channel approach was used to invite alumni to the celebrations:

- Email invitation to all 50+ year graduates in Kansas City and St. Louis
- Postcards to current MAA members who graduated 50+ years ago
- Included event link in chapter e-newsletters (sent to all alumni in KC & STL)



The Gold Medal events were hosted as weekday luncheons and included remarks from MAA's Executive Director and a recognition ceremony where attendees were honored with a medallion. Both events were hosted in private spaces in Italian restaurants; attendees paid \$25 member/\$30 non-member. Guests found this to be an affordable price point, and the menus were well-received by attendees.

Guests were assigned to tables based on their graduation year, which helped foster discussion about their shared experiences at Mizzou. As grads were presented with their medals, they were invited to give short remarks about their favorite Mizzou memories. Although it took time to honor 80+ individuals, sharing and listening to each attendee's memories was very impactful—and many guests indicated that was their favorite part of the event.

These luncheons allowed for strong collaboration with Advancement colleagues. MAA shared registration lists in advance of the events and notified the relationship managers who had assigned donors in attendance. Three to four fundraising colleagues opted to attend each luncheon and found them to be an excellent way to touch base with and steward current donors, while also meeting potential prospects. While the events had very few "no-shows", the Advancement officers used those opportunity to follow up with the honorees who were absent and offer an alternate time to present the medallion and chat about Mizzou.

After each Gold Medal luncheon, MAA surveyed attendees about their event experience as well as share information about other relevant Association programming (Touring Tigers travel, membership, volunteer opportunities, etc.). In the surveys, respondents were very complimentary of the events.

Timeline

- October 2022
 - o Mailed postcards/e-mails for Kansas City luncheon
- November 2022
 - Hosted Kansas City event on November 3
 - Sent Kansas City post-event email and survey
- February 2023
 - o Postcards/E-mails for St. Louis event
- March 2023
 - o Hosted St. Louis event on March 2
 - Sent St. Louis post-event email with photos and survey



Findings and Conclusions

Staff from the Mizzou Alumni Association are very pleased with the outcome of these events. The luncheons were fairly simple and affordable to host, and fostered high engagement and affinity for Mizzou.

Both Kansas City and St. Louis luncheons reached max capacity with 100-120 attendees at each event, and the Association honored 150+ Golden Graduates in total. After hosting the events, MAA staff feel reassured that 120 attendees per event is the maximum size to feel celebratory, yet still intimate enough to recognize everyone.

MAA used the Net Promoter Score (NPS) survey instrument to assess the success of the event. Feedback was very complimentary (Kansas City score=75; St. Louis score = 88). Attendees seemed to appreciate the gold medal honor and enjoyed the opportunity to share their favorite Mizzou memory—and hear others' memories.

The comments also identified a few areas to consider for the future. Although attendees appreciated sitting with other graduates from their class year, conversations were mostly restricted to the tables. In the future staff may look for venues with reception space to accommodate additional socialization outside of the table assignments. There was also feedback about timing. Staff allotted an hour for dining/food service and an hour for the program, but lunch service often ran long. Some guests had to leave for other commitments, although most attendees were not bothered by longer lunch.

In addition to engagement, the luncheons were excellent stewardship events. Many of the attendees were also donors—in total, the Gold Medal attendees have given \$4M+ in gifts to Mizzou! As a result, these events enhanced collaboration with colleagues, and helped to reinforce the Alumni Association's importance and value to Advancement.

The Mizzou Alumni Association plans to host similar events in other strategic markets, as well as repeat events in St. Louis and Kansas City next year. Staff must consider whether to continue to invite all 50-year graduates and older (which would allow repeat attendees), or specifically limit attendance to the 50-year class and their guests. Venue availability and budget may impact that decision.

Budget

Guests registered to attend (\$25 member/\$30 non-member) and the Mizzou Alumni Association subsidized remaining expenses.

Revenues

- Kansas City registrations (95 ppl) = \$2,420
- St. Louis registrations (105 ppl) = \$2,630
- Total Revenue = \$5,050

Expenses

- Kansas City venue/catering = \$5,174
- Kansas City postage for 500 postcards = \$310
- St. Louis venue/catering = \$4582
- St. Louis postage for 620 postcards= \$385
- 500 medallions* x \$3.29 = \$1,645
- Total Expense = \$12,096






